“In recent months, we have, internally, been looking closely at the potential of science communication. We are looking forward to discussing this externally in the coming year and jointly developing formats which promote and foster dialogue between science and society,” states Astrid Eichhorn. She has been elected as the new Speaker of the Board. “At the same time, we are addressing the question of how science will evolve after the Covid-19 pandemic. The pandemic has highlighted opportunities, such as the potential of online formats for climate sustainability, and also exacerbated existing problems, such as gender equality in science.

The Board was elected on 26 March 2021 for a term of one year during *Die Junge Akademie*'s digital spring conference. Its duties include overseeing the strategic and conceptual direction of *Die Junge Akademie*. The spokesperson represents *Die Junge Akademie* externally. The Board's activities overall underpin *Die Junge Akademie*'s objective of getting science and society to connect through relevant topics and innovative formats. The members of *Die Junge Akademie* are currently working in numerous **research groups** and **projects** on topics such as Engaged Science, Diversity, Sustainability and Cultures of Debate.
